

**THOROUGHBRED RACING S.A. LIMITED**  
**STIPENDIARY STEWARDS' REPORT**

**Report on Race Meeting held at Allan Scott Park Morphettville Racecourse**  
**by the South Australian Jockey Club on Saturday, 2 August 2008**

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**Stewards:** G. Loch (Chairman), J. Petzer (F), P. Anderson (HT) & M. Santoro (M), T Williamson & L Smith (Stewards), D. Jonas & H. Milne (Deputy Stewards), Dr. P. Horridge & Dr D Bowden (Veterinary Surgeons).

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**TRACK:** Dead 5 **WEATHER:** Overcast/showery  
At 2.00pm following Race 4 - Track downgrade to Slow 6 (retrospective to Race 4).

**RAIL:** Out 6 metres entire circuit.

**RACE 1 : CLEANEVENT GRAND NATIONAL STEEPLECHASE - 3250 metres**

At the steeple near the 300 metres EGO TRIP (T Wells) made a mistake and fell dislodging T Wells. T Wells was conveyed to Flinders Medical Centre by ambulance. EGO TRIP was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported no visible abnormalities

**RACE 2 : KEVERN KLEMICH MEMORIAL GRAND NATIONAL HURDLE - 3500 metres**

Approaching the first hurdle, in the vicinity of the 1000 metres on the first occasion, SOLITAS (S Pateman) shifted out and contacted FOXES FOLLY (B McLean), resulting in both horses jumping the hurdle awkwardly and becoming unbalanced for several strides on landing

After jumping the second last hurdle in the vicinity of the 300 metres FRENZILLIAN (C Durden) rolled out and brushed SOLITAS (S Pateman).

Approaching the finish FRENZILLIAN (C Durden) shifted out and laid against SOLITAS (S Pateman) which was inconvenienced for several strides.

On the scale S Pateman the rider of the second placegetter SOLITAS lodged an objection against FRENZILLIAN (C Durden) being declared the winner on the grounds of alleged interference at the point of the home turn, after jumping the second last hurdle and approaching the finish. After taking evidence from all parties, on viewing the official footage and acting on their own observations Stewards were satisfied that the consequences of movement by FRENZILLIAN on jumping the second last hurdle and approaching the finish having regard to the beaten margin were sufficient to *uphold* S Pateman's objection. The amended placings were:-

FRENZILLIAN lost its off fore plate during the event.

**RACE 3 : HUTT STREET CENTRE HANDICAP - 1100 metres**

SANDQUILL (J Potter) jumped away awkwardly and shifted out brushing the hindquarters of EMERALD QUEEN (P Roff).

**RACE 3 : HUTT STREET CENTRE HANDICAP - 1100 metres (continued)**

In the vicinity of the 300 metres SUPER CONFIDENT (K Dyson) was inclined to race greenly and shift about.

In the vicinity of the 100 metres MISS BLAKE (M Neilson), which was inclined to race greenly, shifted out onto CERBERUS GIRL (J Maund), which was hampered and obliged to alter course.

J Maund the rider of CERBERUS GIRL was questioned regarding his riding of that filly over the concluding stages J Maund explained his rings had become ineffective due to the saddle shifting back thereby restricting his riding. Stewards accepted J Maund's explanation.

Correct Weight for this event was delayed to allow J Maund the rider and Mr L Kennewell representing Mr G Kennewell the Trainer of the second placegetter CERBERUS GIRL to view the official footage in the straight. After doing so, J Maund lodged an objection against MISS BLAKE (M Neilson) being declared the winner on the grounds of alleged interference from the 250 metres. After taking evidence from all parties, on viewing the official footage and acting on their own observations Stewards *dismissed* J Maund's objection as having regard to the margin they could not be satisfied the extent of the interference suffered by CERBERUS GIRL was sufficient to interfere with the official placings.

**RACE 4 : FLIGHT CENTRE HANDICAP (1) - 1200 metres**

D Tourneur the rider of BLUEPOLES explained that he had been instructed to attempt to lead as the gelding had been successful, two starts previously, when ridden in that manner. He stated that after being positive out of the gates he was surprised to be joined by EJAAD and MIDNIGHT MUSTANG and in an attempt to carry out his instructions he attempted to kick up but he had felt his mount had difficulty in responding in the going. He added that in his opinion BLUEPOLES had not handled the ground. BLUEPOLES was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported no visible abnormalities.

Following this event at 2.00pm the Stewards re-assessed the track conditions to a Slow 6 rating retrospective to Race 4.

**RACE 5 : SCOTT GROUP OF COMPANIES HANDICAP - 2500 metres**

Near the 200 metres JULY (L Hopwood) became held up briefly when racing behind SOUTHERN COURAGE (NZ) (A Patterson).

**RACE 6 : SCHWEPPES HANDICAP - 1600 metres**

VENETIAN STAR (S Price) was inclined to get its head up and race fiercely in the early stages.

In the vicinity of the 1200 metres, when being restrained SELSLEY (B Petherick), was inclined to get its head up and raced ungenerously.

QUOTATION was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported the mare had sustained a lesion to the rear of the near fore fetlock. Mr L Kennewell the Trainer of QUOTATION confirmed the mare would be freshened prior to racing again.

**RACE 7 : IRISH DAY AUGUST 16<sup>TH</sup> HANDICAP - 1200 metres**

Shortly after the start SILENT SOPHIA (S Bailey) rolled out onto SPIRIT OF CAPRI (A Hermann), which was obliged to ease away from the heels of YARTERBERY (P Gatt), which shifted in onto SPIRIT OF CAPRI (A Hermann), which was inconvenienced.

**RACE 7 : IRISH DAY AUGUST 16<sup>TH</sup> HANDICAP - 1200 metres (continued)**

Near the 1000 metres SPIRIT OF CAPRI (A Hermann) was obliged to steady off the heels of ROSSI (L Hopwood), which shifted in. L Hopwood was reprimanded and advised to greater care when shifting ground in future.

J Fry, the rider of QUITE A STIR which performed poorly, explained that the gelding's best performances occurred when able to lead on the fence. He said that due to the pace of the race his mount was off the bridle earlier than he had expected and felt that when obliged to race away from the rail his mount lost interest. QUITE A STIR was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported a slower than normal recovery.

S Price the rider of SARATOGA DREAMS reported that given the run the gelding had in running he had been disappointed in the manner in which it had responded to his riding in the straight and noted on pulling up the gelding had made respiratory noises. SARATOGA DREAMS was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported no visible abnormalities. Mr J Macmillan the Trainer of SARATOGA DREAMS undertook for the gelding to undergo an endoscopic examination and report the results to the TRSA Veterinary Surgeon.

SURELY YOU JEST lost its off fore plate during the event.

**RACE 8 : COFFEE CLUB HANDICAP (2) - 1200 metres**

On arrival on course DUCATS, was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon, who reported the gelding to be suffering from a skin allergy. Following advice from the Club's Veterinary Surgeon, Stewards withdrew DUCATS at 1.24pm. First Aid was administered.

BUSTING COWBOY (A Patterson) jumped away awkwardly.

TWO SHADES OF BLUE (s Bailey) was slow to jump.

Shortly after the start ESPRIT DE DANSE (P Gatt) and MASTER MOOD (T Zanker) brushed.

Near the 100 metres SCRUBBY CREEK (D Robinson) rolled in and brushed ESPRIT DE DANSE (P Gatt).

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**GENERAL****RACE 4 : FLIGHT CENTRE HANDICAP (1) - 1200 metres**

Mr L Oliver the Trainer of MIDNIGHT MUSTANG was questioned in relation to the engagement of a rider for that gelding. After considering the explanations provided Stewards charged Mr Oliver under LRR 18.1.7 in that A Patterson was declared as the rider of that gelding when no engagement had been made and under LRR 18.1.6 in that a substitute rider had been declared without permission of the Stewards. Mr Oliver pleaded guilty to both charges and was fined \$100 for each breach.

Mr Oliver was further cautioned in future to ensure that Mr A Coyne, when representing his stable, provided the true facts of matters that occur and not misrepresent situations.
